#### From Cain to Noah Gen 4&5

The Universal Fall deepens and yet.....

#### A new start-fresh choices? Gen 4 v1-7

- ¹ Adam<sup>[a]</sup> made love to his wife Eve, and she became pregnant and gave birth to Cain.<sup>[b]</sup> She said, "With the help of the LORD I have brought forth<sup>[c]</sup> a man." ² Later she gave birth to his brother Abel.
- Now Abel kept flocks, and Cain worked the soil. <sup>3</sup> In the course of time Cain brought some of the fruits of the soil as an offering to the LORD. <sup>4</sup> And Abel also brought an offering—fat portions from some of the firstborn of his flock. The LORD looked with favor on Abel and his offering, <sup>5</sup> but on Cain and his offering he did not look with favor. So Cain was very angry, and his face was downcast.
- Then the LORD said to Cain, "Why are you angry? Why is your face downcast? <sup>7</sup> If you do what is right, will you not be accepted? But if you do not do what is right, sin is crouching at your door; it desires to have you, but you must rule over it."

## Murder and hardness meets mercy

- 8 Now Cain said to his brother Abel, "Let's go out to the field." While they were in the field, Cain attacked his brother Abel and killed him.
- 9 Then the LORD said to Cain, "Where is your brother Abel?"
- "I don't know," he replied. "Am I my brother's keeper?"
- 10 The LORD said, "What have you done? Listen! Your brother's blood cries out to me from the ground. 11 Now you are under a curse and driven from the ground, which opened its mouth to receive your brother's blood from your hand. 12 When you work the ground, it will no longer yield its crops for you. You will be a restless wanderer on the earth."
- 13 Cain said to the LORD, "My punishment is more than I can bear. 14 Today you are driving me from the land, and I will be hidden from your presence; I will be a restless wanderer on the earth, and whoever finds me will kill me."
- 15 But the LORD said to him, "Not so<sup>[e]</sup>; anyone who kills Cain will suffer vengeance seven times over." Then the LORD put a mark on Cain so that no one who found him would kill him. 16 So Cain went out from the LORD's presence and lived in the land of Nod,<sup>[f]</sup> east of Eden.

### New Testament explains ......

- Luke 11 v 50 Therefore this generation will be held responsible for the blood of all the prophets that has been shed since the beginning of the world, <sup>51</sup> from the blood of Abel to the blood of Zechariah, ...
- Heb 11 v4 <sup>4</sup> By faith Abel brought God a better offering than Cain did. By faith he was commended as righteous, when God spoke well of his offerings. And by faith Abel still speaks, even though he is dead.....
- Heb 12 v 24But you have come to Mount Zion,...to Jesus the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel......
- I John 3v15 For this is the message you heard from the beginning: We should love one another. <sup>12</sup> Do not be like Cain, who belonged to the evil one and murdered his brother. And why did he murder him? Because his own actions were evil and his brother's were righteous.

## Development but more decline Gen 4v 17-24

- Cain made love to his wife, and she became pregnant and gave birth to Enoch.
   Cain was then building a city, and he named it after his son Enoch. <sup>18</sup> To Enoch was born Irad, and Irad was the father of Mehujael, and Mehujael was the father of Methushael, and Methushael was the father of Lamech.
- 19 Lamech married two women, one named Adah and the other Zillah. 20 Adah gave birth to Jabal; he was the father of those who live in tents and raise livestock. 21 His brother's name was Jubal; he was the father of all who play stringed instruments and pipes. 22 Zillah also had a son, Tubal-Cain, who forged all kinds of tools out of [g] bronze and iron. Tubal-Cain's sister was Naamah.
- 23 Lamech said to his wives,
- "Adah and Zillah, listen to me; wives of Lamech, hear my words.
  - I have killed a man for wounding me, a young man for injuring me.
  - <sup>24</sup> If Cain is avenged seven times, then Lamech seventy-seven times."
- AND THEN......

### The promise returns ....

- 25 Adam made love to his wife again, and she gave birth to a son and named him Seth, [h] saying, "God has granted me another child in place of Abel, since Cain killed him." 26 Seth also had a son, and he named him Enosh.
- At that time people began to call on<sup>[i]</sup> the name of the LORD.

# Light in the dark and Gods patience Gen 5 v 21-32

- <sup>21</sup> When Enoch had lived 65 years, he became the father of Methuselah. <sup>22</sup> After he became the father of Methuselah, Enoch walked faithfully with God 300 years and had other sons and daughters. <sup>23</sup> Altogether, Enoch lived a total of 365 years.
   <sup>24</sup> Enoch walked faithfully with God; then he was no more, because God took him away.
  - HEB 11 v <sup>5</sup> By faith Enoch was taken from this life, so that he did not experience death: "He could not be found, because God had taken him away." [a] For before he was taken, he was commended as one who pleased God. <sup>6</sup> And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.
- <sup>25</sup> When Methuselah had lived 187 years, he became the father of Lamech. <sup>26</sup> After he became the father of Lamech, Methuselah lived 782 years and had other sons and daughters. <sup>27</sup> Altogether, Methuselah lived a total of 969 years, and then he died.
- When Lamech had lived 182 years, he had a son. <sup>29</sup> He named him Noah<sup>[c]</sup> and said, "He will comfort us in the labor and painful toil of our hands caused by the ground the LORD has cursed." <sup>30</sup> After Noah was born, Lamech lived 595 years and had other sons and daughters. <sup>31</sup> Altogether, Lamech lived a total of 777 years, and then he died.
- 32 After Noah was 500 years old, he became the father of Shem, Ham and Japheth.
